

Your Investment Accomplishes So Much

\$1 per week, or \$52 per year, provides prescription medications for a free clinic patient for an entire year.

\$2 per week, or \$104 per year, provides food for a family for a week.

\$5 per week, or \$260 per year, provides 52 home delivered meals to an elderly person. Last year over 33,490 meals were delivered.
